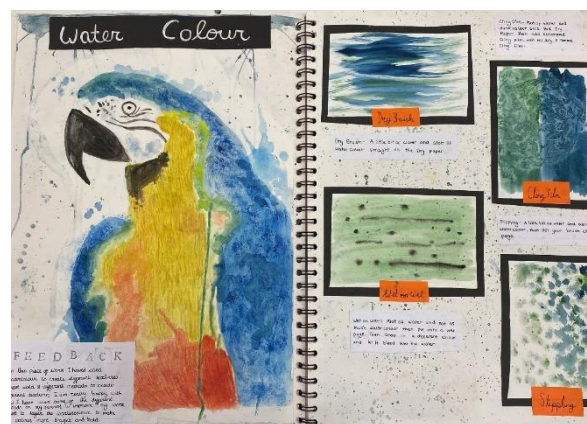
Art and Technology

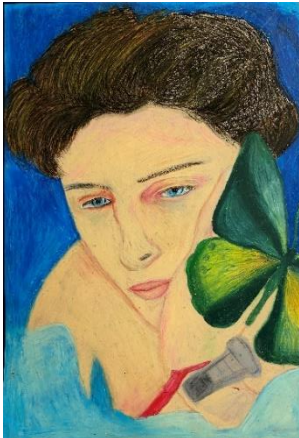
We have been overwhelmed with the quality of work being produced by year 9; while looking at the qualities of using biro to show shape and form they have surpassed themselves this half term.

Year 10 have made a great start to their GCSE by learning new skills and developing their coursework with some beautiful sketchbook work.

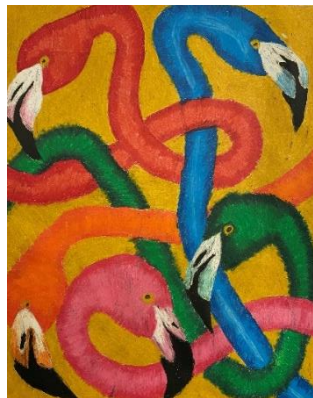

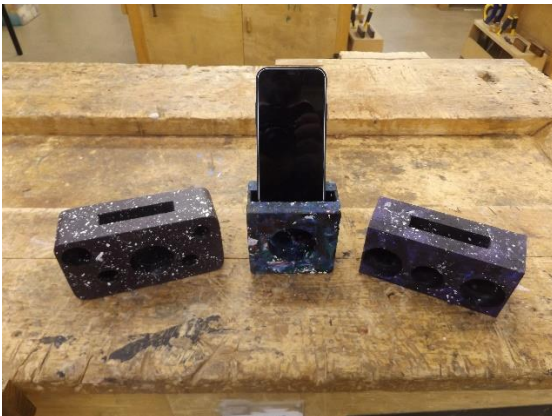
And once again Year 11 continued with their GCSE portfolios producing exiting and innovative storage solutions.

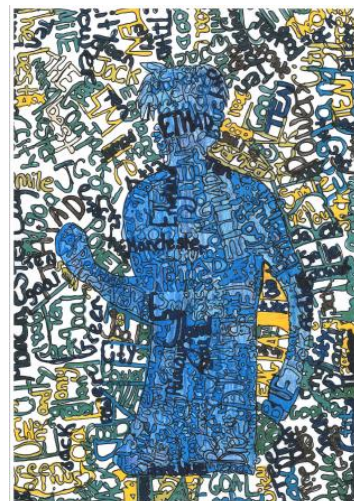

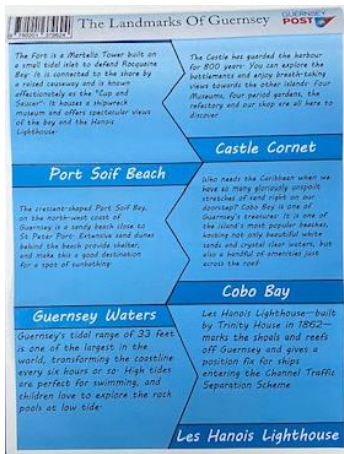
